


Christmas Acres –

We're so grateful for their generosity and heart.

Fighting Food Insecurity

Our mission is to alleviate hunger in Johnson County.

We appreciate the opportunities to team up with caring organizations that offer the resources our neighbors need. This included improving the nutritional component of the food we offer and better meeting the needs of seniors and homebound clients:

- ▼ CICOA (Central Indiana Council on Aging) Aging and In-Home Solutions provides food to help meet the nutritional needs of low-income senior adults. The pantry teamed with CICOA to enroll qualifying county seniors and distribute commodity boxes that include nutritional, non-perishable food monthly. This food source is available in addition to the groceries provided by the pantry.
- ♥ Gleaners Food Bank of Indiana created Groceries2Go, a program using DoorDash for deliveries to homebound food insecure individuals and families. Through this partnership the pantry was able to expand our existing home delivery service to more Johnson County neighbors.
- Franciscan Health provided a grant that extended our ability to obtain nutritious food offerings.
